1. In verse 45 Jesus uses the phrase "the least of these," but in verse 40 he uses a more exact phrase: "the least of these of my brothers.". The two phrases refer to the same group. So the more complete phrase in verse 40 should be used to explain the shorter phrase in verse 45. Whatever "the least of these" is about, it's about "the least of these" who are brothers.

Who Are 'The Least of These'?

Matthew 25 gives few clues as to who "the least of these" are. They're described only as hungry, thirsty, homeless, naked, sick, and imprisoned. Building on paucity of information in the text, at...

What You Probably Don't Know about 'The Least of These ...

The "least of these" refers to those in a variety of needy situations. They include the hungry, thirsty, impoverished, sick, and imprisoned. In this context, Jesus is speaking to those on His right, that is, the righteous. The needy are called Christ's "brothers"; thus, the reference is to the righteous helping fellow disciples.

But then I was also struck with the words, "the least of these who are members of my family" (v. 40). Jesus says that when he returns, he will welcome those who fed him when he was hungry, gave him a drink when he was thirsty, welcomed him when he was a stranger, clothed him when he was naked, visited him when he was sick, and came to him when he was in prison.
